Suzanne Schmitz is the owner of the Ontario Save-A-Lot store and three others. All of the Save-A-Lot stores in the western New York area are franchised and independently owned. As her first job, Schmitz started working as a cashier at a Save-A-Lot in the Buffalo area and stayed with them until she opened her own store. Schmitz moved up within the organization to district manager of 5 stores. In 2010 Schmitz opened her first of 4 stores, opening the Ontario store in 2014.

Store owners sign an agreement which allows the owners to use the Save-A-Lot name and also commits the owners to purchase the bulk of items sold at Save-A-Lot from the corporation. Most of the items come on one truck, a few times a week. In addition to supplying items for sale, the corporation also helps coordinate the advertising. There are 1,300 stores across 46 states in the United States.

Save-A-Lot supplies about 85% of the items in the store. Store owners buy some meat and produce locally. They purchase items such as Upstate Milk, Heluva Good Cheese, Zweigle's, and many others locally. Schmitz wants to stress that they do cut meat at this location. There are butchers on site every day. She takes pride in selling the highest quality fresh cut meat at very reasonable prices.

Schmitz is very happy with the sales at the Ontario location. The store is out-performing projected sales but there is still room to grow. This is a very competitive industry where everybody wants to be a discount grocery store. You are seeing more and more private label goods in the conventional grocery stores. They operate on a very low margin, relying on volume to offset higher prices. They are a hard discounter, with very low prices on canned goods and those kinds of staple items. While the store may not have as much variety as a conventional supermarket, they offer low prices on all the items customers buy most, while featuring the full produce and fresh cut meat departments.

Schmitz likes to respond to the local customers, so she tries to honor requests from clients for items that she would not normally stock. Melissa Jozwiak is the store manager and has been with the store since it opened. The store currently has around 15 employees.

Prodromos (Pro) Konstantinou states that his father said ten years ago, "We should open a liquor store". This suggestion came from the lack of a reliable supply of wine and whiskey in the area. Konstantinou attempted to purchase the local liquor store but was unsuccessful. This unsuccessful attempt to purchase an existing store led directly to the renovation of existing space and opening the new facility at Konstantinou Corner.

The liquor store opened November 11, 2008. The store has been doing well ever since it opened. We have good visibility and access here. The size of this store is just right.

Konstantinou tries to carry the items that people want. To do this Konstantinou relied on the local distributors. As time advanced, Pro started to remove items from the shelf that did not move. This gave him the opportunity to place requested items on the shelf. The same held true for requested items, if they don't move, they are removed and replaced with another product. This is a great way to keep the stock fresh and interesting. In addition to Ouzo, Konstantinou Liquor stocks five Greek wines, and several Greek spirits, including "Metaxas", a Greek Brandy.

As one may expect, the Holidays are the best time to sell liquors. This includes all of the holidays but especially the time just before Christmas through the New Year. Konstantinou says "Those two holidays take the cake".

Konstantinou states that he deals with the two major distributors in the area, as well as several smaller ones. We also deal with several wineries directly.

Wine tastings are sponsored by the wineries. We have to coordinate with the winery for the dates and times. We usually do tasting on Thursday, Friday or Saturday. The tastings are usually between 5 to 8 pm. If folks choose to purchase wine at tasting, we usually offer a discount.

We offer a 10% discount if you purchase a case of wine. The case of wine can be a mixed variety. We do special orders, if a client asks us for something we do not stock, we will research the product for them and then order it if they wish. For our 187-milliliter products, we offer personalized labels. These make great favors for special events. There are 4 employees in the store.
