Chamber Tours Headwater Food Hub

On August 29th the Ontario Chamber of Commerce were the guests of a business tour hosted by Headwater Food Hub, located at 6318 Ontario Center Road, Ontario, NY. Phil Bianchi, Marketing and Accounts Manager, was our tour guide and his enthusiasm and passion for his work was obvious. He explained the good Food Collective that follows (Community Supported Agriculture) the CSA model. This is where families and individuals sign up for an allotment of food to be delivered. This began with 100 members and has grown to 1400 members at the present time. They can pick from a spring, summer fall or winter share and have fresh vegetables, fruits, meats, and frozen items delivered. The wholesale portion of the business began in 2007 and includes such accounts as the University of Rochester; St. John Fisher College; Wayne Central School District; Rochester City School District; retirement institutions; and 50 Rochester and Ithaca restaurants plus some in the New York City area. The business name, Headwater Food Hub encompasses both aspects of the operation, CSA and wholesale. The goal is to always put the farmer first and help him be successful. They will pay the farmer \$.80 cents on the dollar where a distributor will pay only \$.20 cents. Headwater has 40-80 local farmers within a 45-mile radius of the food hub; the farthest being in the Adirondacks. The CSA provides the farmer with a captive market for their produce. Headwater also provides liability insurance for the farmer and supplies packaging materials in bulk, which can be reused.

All farmers that Headwater deals with must use sustainable farming practices. They must follow Integrated Pest Management (IPM) methods that encourage natural pest control mechanisms and keep the use of pesticides at a reduced level to minimize risks to human health and the environment.

New things on the horizon include the expansion into adding a butchering facility and supplying all SUNY schools with organic ground beef. The chamber tour also viewed a chopping and washing room that will soon be open, dedicated for the processing of local lettuce. Mr. Bianchi advised that workers would be dressed in clean gowns; hairnets; etc. to ensure all health standards are met.

Some of the on-going renovations to the building included removing the large, cypress wood vats that use to hold sauerkraut when Victor Preserving occupied the building. Now the wholesale section is open with large sliding doors off the main corridor opening into sectioned off processing areas, some with refrigeration. Funding came from a grant from USDA and Wayne County Industrial Development.

Chris Hartman, President of Headwater Food Hub said the Ontario location was a good fit for the business. It is near Rochester, which is the main market area, plus it is near the farmers – the food source! Phil Bianchi agreed that the area has what is necessary for the next Silicon Valley for the food industry: good soil; an abundant source of water; plus a good work resource of people from the local area. Mr. Hartman said he looks forward to many more years operating Headwater Food Hub in Ontario and also looks forward to working with other organizations or companies in the food cluster industry that may be interested in moving to Ontario.

Headwater Food Hub employs 14 fulltime in a core group and during the busy season they add 6 to 8 additional employees. They have a fleet of seven, refrigerated vehicles for the transportation of produce.
