You can report calls that come through to you despite your name being on the list by calling 1-888-382-1222 or going online to www.donotcall.gov.

You can also report any "Robo-calls" you receive even if you do not have your number on the list. Try to remember what the call was about when you make your report (i.e vacations, constructions, etc.)

You can now drop off medications that are no longer needed at the Wayne County Clerk's DMV office located at 9 Pearl St., Lyons, NY 14489 during regular business hours. The hours are 9 am to 4:45 pm, Monday through Friday. Items accepted are prescriptions, prescription ointments, pet medications, prescription patches, over-the-counter medications, and vitamins. Items that will NOT be accepted are needles, inhalers, aerosol cans, thermometers, lotions, liquids or hydrogen peroxide. The box will be emptied by the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and contents incinerated.
