Local History Is Only A “Click” Away

Town Historians and representatives of historical societies have worked together to develop an online database dedicated to the historic sites of Wayne County. The document was created by the Wayne Historians’ Organization (WHO), a collaboration of municipal historians and historical society representatives that meets bi-monthly to share best practices and discuss current issues.

The database includes information about museums, historic markers, architectural features, churches, schools, cemeteries, industries, transportation, murals, civic organizations and much more.

Some sites have a considerable amount of historical information and some do not. Each site reflects a piece of Wayne County history, The goal is to create a greater awareness of the unique cultural heritage and history of Wayne County and encourage visitors and residents alike to enjoy the wonderful historic sites.

Sites and topics in each town or village are searchable. A simple “click” opens to detailed information and pictures. Sometimes, links are provided to more information or a hot link to GPS coordinates. A map will appear showing the location of the historic site. The majority of the sites are private property and are not open to the public but are generally visible from public streets.

Wayne County is one of the few counties in New York State to have such an extensive database. General coordination is provided by the Wayne Historians’ Organization and the Office of the Wayne County Historian.

To suggest additional sites or listings on the database, contact your local town or village historian.

The count is mandated by the Constitution and conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, a nonpartisan government agency. The 2020 Census counts the population in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories (Puerto Rico, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands). Each home will receive an invitation to respond to a short questionnaire—**online, by phone, or by mail**. This will mark the first time that you will be able to respond to the census online. By mid-March, households will start receiving mail from the U.S. Census Bureau.

Why The Census Is Conducted

The census provides critical data that lawmakers, business owners, teachers, and many others use to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community. Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to hospitals, fire departments, schools, roads, and other resources **based on census data**.

The results of the census also determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives, and they are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts.

NEW COALITION PROVIDES COMMON VOICE FOR LOCAL CHAMBERS & BUSINESSES

In August, 2019, the Greater Rochester Chamber of Commerce invited representatives of local Chambers to gather at their office at 250 State Street to consider participation in joint advocating for legislative and common items of interest. From this initial meeting and subsequent monthly gatherings, the Advocacy Coalition of Rochester Area Chambers (ACRAC) was formed. Ontario Chamber of Commerce has participated since the initial meeting; our treasurer and former local legislator Jim Switzer serves as our representative.

Topics at the meetings ranged from current pressing topics such as flooding along Lake Ontario, broadband access and minimum wage levels to the striking workers' bill, the New York Health Act and protecting local businesses from harmful regulations and policies.

At the January meeting, the ACRAC members reviewed results of a recent survey that indicated issues of top importance – mandates, taxes, economic development, workforce development – and outlined possible items for a 2020 legislative position paper. Additional topics were expected from the Governor's State of the State message on January 8th.

R.E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant Employees Donate \$172,000 to Community Organizations through Employee Giving Campaign

ONTARIO, N.Y. — Exelon Generation employees and the Exelon Foundation are donating more than \$4.6 million to support charitable organizations in the communities around its power plants. “NOVEMBER, 2019, BUSINESS OF THE MONTH”

EASTSIDE TRADERS Pawn Shop & Target Retrieval Range is the November 2019 “Business of the Month” for the Ontario Chamber of Commerce. Nick Affronti, 36, designed the 7,500 sq. ft. triple-wall structure which opened on December 15, 2018 @ 1200 Wooster Way. It contains a 3,200 sq. ft. “state-of-the-art” target retrieval range fully licensed by the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Firearms, Tobacco and Explosives (AFTE) of the Department of Justice as well as local permits.

Nick is an 2001 alumnus of Wayne Central High School and is the third generation of families in both Walworth, where he grew up and now resides with his fiancée, and Ontario. His maternal great-grandfather, William Vaughn, was owner and editor of the *WAYNE COUNTY MAIL-Ontario REGISTER* (now merged with the *Sun-Record-MAIL*) for 43 years (1903 to 1946) and his parents own and operate Hilltop Enterprises asphalt paving and snowplowing businesses in Walworth. Site preparation, excavation, drainage, grading, asphalt and completion was done by his dad and the family business.

Nick worked for the family business and operated an independent driveway sealing company. As a teen, Nick learned proper uses of firearms & pistols and enjoyed shooting skeet and taking pilot license training. He was intrigued by buy-sell-trade-pawn businesses and researched operations of Rochester area pawn shops,. He opened a pawn shop in March of 2016 with a lease from owner Bruce Carey in the former Pizza Hut @ 1208 NYS Route 104 at the corner of Johncox Drive. He credits Bruce with continual support and encouragement for starting his business and for handling “tons of details” on development and construction of the new store & location, also owned by Carey

After completing federal training and licensing for firearm, he was issued a federal firearms license and a range officer permit from the Bureau of AFTE. He holds his concealed carry permit from the U.S. Concealed Carry Association (U.S.C.C.A.) and state permits as a pistol dealer.

Eastside Traders buys-sells-trades a variety of items, ranging from electronics, yard equipment, power tools, ammunition, diamonds, gold, silver, coins to antiques, collectibles, electronics, video games and guitars. He also sells-trades-buys new and used firearms and provides them for rent in the on-site target retrieval range.

Nick and his licensed staff offer one-on-one training and coaching for individuals and couples on proper use and purchase of firearms and the target range. Several law enforcement, probation & parole officers in Wayne and Monroe counties maintain their firearm permits and training requirements at the range. Solo use of the target range is restricted to person’s age 18 or older and age 12 or older when accompanied by eligible parent or guardian.

“We have a strict policy on proper training and full identification for rental, purchase, sale, trade or use of firearms at our facility,” Nick noted. “We work very closely with the local law enforcement & parole agencies to keep illegal firearms off the street and out of pawn shops.” Detailed federal, state and local pawn-sale-trade and use records are maintained on a daily basis, he added.

Monthly membership plans are offered. Firearms, supplies and gunsmith services are available. Look for Eastside Traders on *Facebook* or contact them by **e-mail** @ eastsidetraderson2016@gmail.com, by **phone** @ 315-333-5819 or **stop in** to meet Nick and his highly trained and experienced staff.

Both the pawn shop and target range are open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Monday thru Friday and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.
