# **New Developments In Ontario**

- Intergrow Greenhouses. The proposal is to construct greenhouses for growing hydroponic tomatoes and includes +/-57.7 acres of greenhouses and 112,000 square feet of office and support space. The company is owned by Dirk Biemans and will be located on Timothy Lane. ConstructionIs anticipated to begin late 2017.
- **476 NYS Route 104**. Basement Technologies, owned by Kansas and Patrick McDonald intend to use the existing structure for office space and construct storage buildings. The former motel has now been demolished and renovation has begun for the new office.
- **348 NYS Route 104**. An existing building will be renovated for the use as a pet crematorium. The parcel is owned by Michael Harris.

Jen Nudd, owner of photoCHICA Photography Studios, states that opening the studio in Ontario was not a difficult decision. "Living in the area and having close family ties here did help me select Ontario. However, I did my research and realized that the location of the studio was not as important as the product produced in it. The professional aspect of my photography started ten years ago and the studio has been open for three years now. My overall interest in photography started with West Irondequoit High School art classes over 20 years ago."

The photoCHICA name is sort of a step away from the traditional business naming process. Most photographers use their name in the name of the business. I struggled with this departure. My inner circle of friends supported me with this choice and one said "Jen, it sounds like you." It has worked out for me, and has become sort of a brand. In fact some people call me Chica now instead of Jen.

This studio space is fantastic. I like to change out props and colors to keep it from becoming boring. I also like to change items to match the seasons. I love creative and theme shoots and I can adapt the studio space to meet any themes.

I use a variety of photo editing tools. I have found that using only one photo editing tool does not meet all of my needs. My digital platform is PC based. I am a Canon girl all the way.

My work is mostly people based. I have tried landscapes but they just do not work for me. Babies, I love them, they are squishy. However I like to capture images of babies within 10 days of their birth. At about 10 days they become aware of their limbs. I do weddings, engagements, commercials, senior pictures, family events, and magazines. Two of the magazines I contribute to are Healthy Edge and Prolific Quarterly. I love the creativity associated with shooting for magazines. I have clients from Buffalo, Syracuse, Corning, and even Canada. I have also gone out of state to areas in North Carolina and Florida for work

The business has been great, growing every year. Having professional photos taken is a luxury for most families. I appreciate the fact that people reach out to me for capturing these special moments in their lives. When I open the laptop and look at the smiles on the faces that I have captured on any given day, I realize that this is exactly what I was meant to do. I find it very refreshing when clients have been coming to me for years. It is a huge blessing and compliment to have people come to me for family pictures, then senior pictures, engagements, weddings and first born.
